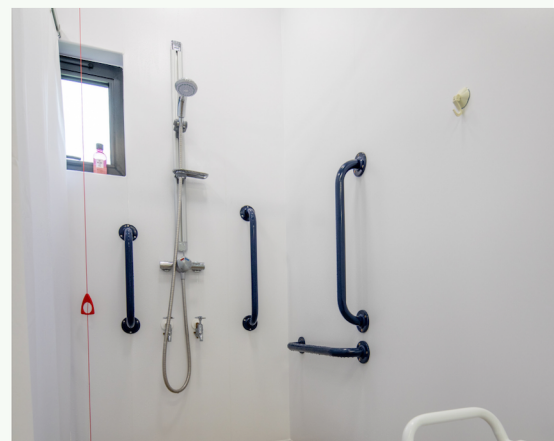

THE PROJECT

After being contacted by Somerset NHS Foundation Trust to deliver this unique specification, Elite Systems became involved in designing, manufacturing, and installing the bespoke modular building for the NHS hydrotherapy unit.

The 10.2 x 9.8m unit was built with patient needs in mind, featuring a temperature-controlled pool, specialist equipment, a hoist, extra storage, changing rooms, and an administrative station.

The Larch wood cladding provided a welcoming aesthetic that blended with the surroundings.

The feedback we've had from patients has been amazing so far – they love it! We even struggle getting them back out of the water. The building is used to help a wide range of people, from as young as one year old to the elderly and those with learning difficulties too.
