We designed, manufactured, and built the single-storey six classroom block within the specified timeframe - including all enabling works - over the summer period.

This was a multi-classroom block, with each of the classrooms between 56m<sup>2</sup> and 59m<sup>2</sup>, and was designed to be inclusive, with disabled access doors and accessible WC as well as male and female toilet facilities, and a work room. All elements were manufactured in our factory before being finished on-site.

Our customer wanted the new building to fit aesthetically with the neighbouring sports hall, so we completed the block with a complementary light blue exterior cladding.

Our recent project in Tameside for just four weeks to complete on-site, showcasing the benefits of work in off-site modular construction.
